The God Who Intervenes

How often our worldview hinders our ability to understand God's presence in our world! Shaped by unquestioned assumptions about the nature of man and physical reality, this worldview ignores not only the evidence, but the possibility, that the reality in which we live is greater than that which can be perceived by purely physical senses. We need a different worldview, a different mindset.

Today's Gospel Acclamation pokes holes in the assumption that God is not actively engaged in our world, neatly harmonizes today's readings, and points us towards the reality of the God who intervenes. It states: "God has called us through the Gospel to possess the glory of our Lord Jesus Christ." 'Glory' here means: a manifestation, or showing, of power or might.

In today's Gospel Jesus provides a superabundance of wine – 120 to 180 gallons. *That's a lotta wine!* He demonstrates God's super-abundant mercy towards us, foreshadows His role as the Bridegroom of the Church (see the first reading), and reveals His glory, His power, for the first time. St. Augustine says that this new wine symbolizes the gift of the Holy Spirit given to each member of His Church as a share in His supernatural life.

This Gift and these graces (see the second reading) are supernatural, God's expression of His glory, His power. They "directly or indirectly benefit the Church, ordered as they are to her building up, to the good of men, and to the needs of the world." (CCC 799).

Why does God do this? Because He loves us! In these gifts He becomes intimately involved in our lives and gives us His power to bring His love to our world (1 Corinthians 12-14:1). He's a good guest! Will you ask Him today for more of His Spirit? (Luke 11:13).
