Dear Brothers and Sisters,

"Today, Jesus presents to us his program of evangelization. His program is the fulfillment of the prophecy of Isaiah 61: "The Spirit of the Lord is upon me to bring good news to the poor, to proclaim liberty to captives, to proclaim the Lord's vear of favor..."

It is important to note that this good news is not directed only to the materially poor, but to all who are poor in spirit. "Blessed are the poor in spirit for theirs is the kingdom of God" (Mat 5:3). The kingdom that Christ has come to establish is open to all who will humbly receive him. All those who have the necessary disposition to receive the good news are poor in spirit. These necessary dispositions include charity and generosity which manifests in service towards the poor and all those are suffering in different ways.

The good news liberates us from two types of slavery. The first is a personally imposed slavery. This is the result of our personal sins and mistakes in life. This slavery makes us, spiritually exiled, blind and deaf. It cripples our spiritual life, and hardens our hearts against God and all that is good. It is the worst form of slavery and only Christ can liberate us from this slavery.

The other type of slavery is that which is imposed on us by the society. These include structural, economic, and physical injustices that do not allow us to live a fulfilled life in this world.

It is important to note that our liberation from all these slaveries is possible only when the spirit of God resides in all of us and inspires us to remain as one body. Body has many parts but functions as one. We have many differences and directions but we need to remain in one Spirit. Can the world remain in one spirit? Until then we need to evangelize.
