

Every year, on the second Sunday of Lent, we recount the story of the Transfiguration of Jesus on the mountaintop. Accompanied by three disciples, Peter, James and John, Jesus on the mountain is "transfigured" in the presence of Moses and Elijah. And this event, like so many others, leads us to ask the all-important question, "Why and for what?" And so: What does this event mean for me and you - now, in this time, in this place where God has planted us?

In my view, it follows that you and I are asked to consider ways in which our life might need a kind of "transfiguration" (or, perhaps better, a transformation) in order to better recognize the gifts that are offered us, and to avoid being blinded to them by the reality of sin that so easily obscures them.

The mountain-top experience today is the experience we get during mass as we receive Jesus in our heart spiritually and into our body physically. It means we don't change our face or hands but we allow them to be transfigured like Jesus. Remember the prayer, Jesus doesn't have hands now but mine; no face but mine...

Our call is not to a new land; our call is not to be a new people. Our call is to new life as God's holy people - new life made possible by God's gift of his Son Jesus, new life made possible because Jesus has conquered death, new life because Jesus continues to offer us the gift of his saving grace in Eucharist.

In all honesty and humility, we must all admit that we are transfigured whenever we live our life by the Word of Jesus.
