

Love God and Love Neighbor Congratulation to Confirmation Students

The celebration of Holy Mass and Confirmation liturgy this weekend calls us to Love God and Love Neighbor.

Christianity is a very concrete and practical religion. It might be easy enough to love God but the simple test of whether we do or not is how do we love, relate to our brothers and sisters. With our blood relatives it might be reasonably easy but what of the widow, orphan and poor person spoken of in the first reading from the Book of Exodus? This Book tells us of the need to be concretely concerned.

The early Church Fathers said that if we have plenty of clothes especially those items we never use and do not share them with the poor we are stealing from them. Strong words indeed. So loving our neighbors as ourselves means loving them as if they are members of our own family, as if they were our own.

The danger here is that we may think we know better than Jesus. He states very clearly that the two loves are equally important. Is there not a danger that we might be arrogant in thinking we know better than Jesus when we choose one or the other but not both? The reason Jesus emphasizes our need to love God and so be rooted in His Love is that prayer, the Mass etc. are the vital means of enabling us to love the neighbor. In Christianity we cannot be **Do It Yourself** people. We need God's enabling power, that is, the Holy Spirit. We need to be nourished at the Eucharist and by the Word of God in order to have the capacity, the ability to love our neighbor.

Dear Confirmandi's, As you are confirmed, keep this in your heart that God calls you to love Him in the neighbor.

Love God and Love Neighbor.

Praying The Sign of the Cross: The Meaning of the Words and the Gesture: As Catholics, we always begin and end our prayers with the Sign of the Cross, which is a prayer – not just an introduction. When we "cross" ourselves we are reminded that Jesus died on the cross for our sins, proving how much God loves us. Each time we make the Sign of the Cross and pray the words, we remember that God is Father, Son and Holy Spirit, and we give praise to the three Persons of the Blessed Trinity. "In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen." We are praying in the name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. In the words of The Sign of the Cross, we are calling upon the power of the name of God. The words "In the name of" are synonymous with "In the Person of". We are placing ourselves under the power and authority of the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. It is essential to know that the prayer, the Sign of the Cross, is not complete when leaving out the words "In the name of." "Christians are baptized in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit: not in their names, for there is only one God, the almighty Father, His only Son and the Holy Spirit: The Most Holy Trinity." (Catechism of the Catholic Church, paragraph 233).
