We are very close to the end of the liturgical year A. Next Week, we will be celebrating Christ the King Feast and will enter into Advent. At this time, Jesus calls us to reflect on how important or worth we are as sons and daughters of God.

Everyone is given talents accordingly. Do we make use of them for our benefit and benefit of the Kingdom of God? We all do but there are some they don't. The parable is for them.

The third servant in the parable made threefold offense: first, he did not use the money according to its purpose. In burying it, it was not able to help other people, and so it did not grow. He did not count his giftedness. Instead, he compared himself with the other two servants, and in the process, he looked down on himself and even accused the master of being "a hard man, reaping where he had not sown." In all these, it was clear that he was not a trustworthy servant.

In all honesty, we have to admit that sometimes we are like this third servant and there is a lot more in the society. Today, we are called to pray for these lost and unworthy servants for their repentance of heart.

It is not important I do the right thing. It is much more important that I have a free and peaceful relationship with God, the Master of our life.

Know that Christ is our King, Next Weekend.
