Dear People of God,

I wish you a very merry Christmas and awe-filled New Year.

The birth of Jesus has become a universal feast and celebrated by people of different faiths. It is the one feast that unites the whole world together to seek peace and joy. Thanks be to God.

As we celebrate Christmas, Pope Francis called us to draw our attention to the problems of the world. He pointed out that consumerism has "hijacked" Christmas from us. Christmas, he said, must not be reduced to a merely sentimental or consumerist celebration, rich in gifts and good wishes but poor in Christian faith. A good Christmas is to help the poor and work for the equality of the world.

The Pope called us to walk away from pessimism that has spread today because of the pandemic. As we rediscover and become aware that the humble and poor Child, hidden and helpless, is God Himself, made man for us, the Pope said, we cannot allow ourselves to be overwhelmed by defeats, failures and the sense of disquieting bewilderment.

The event of the birth of Jesus shows us that "God did not look down on us, did not pass us by, was not repulsed by our misery, did not clothe Himself superficially in a body, but rather He fully assumed our nature and our human condition". He suffered and won the suffering and death. So, Jesus the baby will help us to win the suffering and death caused by illness and virus. Let us be strong in Faith and bring the healing of God on earth.

COMMUNICATION TO ALL

- ◆ The Bishop has highlighted that the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays remains dispensed. No one is required, under the pain of mortal sin, to attend Mass until further notice. In fact, at this time he encourage those over 65 and particularly those with underlying health issues to stay home. He ask those parishes that have the ability to livestream the Mass to continue do so for the sake of those who will not be able to attend. We are to continue to wear a mask when attending Mass.
- ◆ Diaconate Discernment Retreat Saturday, February 27 Are you a man at least 35 years of age who feels a yearning to give yourself more radically to the service of God and the Church − preaching the Gospel, serving those in need, assisting at the altar? If you think God may be calling you to be a deacon, talk to your pastor about attending the Diaconate Discernment Retreat at St. Mary's Church in Altoona on February 27, 2021.
