

ARE YOU PREPARED?

The 2nd reading today continues the Church's traditional Advent emphasis on eschatology, the doctrine of the end of the world. Here she sets before us one of the most explicit New Testament passages about the end of the world as we know it - not removed, but renewed, as a new heavens and a new earth. Peter prophecies, "... do not ignore this one fact, beloved, that the Lord ... does not wish that any should perish, but that all should reach repentance. But the day of the Lord will come like a thief, and then the heavens will pass away with a loud noise, and the elements will be dissolved with fire, and the earth and the works that are upon it will be burned up.... [Therefore] be zealous to be found by him without spot or blemish, and at peace."

God is patient because the more time he gives humanity, the more time there is for individuals to repent and be saved. But His patience doesn't last forever! He has set a day to judge the world and all who dwell in it. At that time, opportunity to repent ceases. So too, when we die, *our* world ends, and our opportunity to repent ceases.

How then should we live? Because this world will end, Peter tells us we should live lives of piety and holiness. The word "holy" means to be "set apart" - set apart from sin and set apart for God; set apart from this world for the world to come; living in this world but detached from it. In this way we will be judged fit to live eternally with our holy God who loves us and has provided a means of escape from spiritual death – repentance.

Ever wonder why holiness seems to be decreasing in our secular culture? Secularism itself comes from a word meaning "this age" or "this world." Living in a secular context, for *this* world, and not for the world to come; attached to *this* world, its pleasures and its delights, rather than preparing for the world to come is why secular people don't rest on Sunday. Over and over again, the early Church Fathers talk about Sunday rest as a way of honoring God's 1st rest; but it's also the 8th day, the day of the resurrection. It points forward to his new creation. Every time a person rests on Sunday, they anticipate the new heavens, the new earth, and the new creation which begins on the day Jesus rose from the tomb.

So if we really believe Jesus rose from the dead, and if we really believe that His bodily resurrection is a fore-taste of a new creation, then we should live that way every single week, reminding ourselves that this world is passing away and preparing for the greater one coming. God bless!
