My sisters and brothers in Christ,

Let us give all to the Lord and receive from the Lord whatever He sends us. Although we want to give all to the Lord, we often find that what the Lord wants of us seems more than we can give.

Most of us don't have the faith that we see in Abraham in the first reading today from the Book of Genesis. Would God actually ask a father to kill his own son? This is God asking something immoral from a human. The only answer to this difficulty is that God does not actually, in the end, ask Abraham to kill his own son.

We may doubt at times what God might ask of us. We find it difficult to accept the evil that is in our world, the bad things that happen to good people, the atrocities against people that go unpunished, the school shootings and now the spread of COVID-19. Always people ask how a good God can allow such evils to happen. Yet such questions are truly not about God but about us humans with our sinfulness. We are broken beings who don't always choose what is right and good. God gave us this freedom. And we misuse our freedom.

The real question is this: why don't we humans always choose what is good and what is right? If we can't, why blame God? We need change, not God.

So our readings today are clear: seek to do the will of God in all things, believe that Christ died and was raised from the dead for us and see in the Transfiguration of Christ that we also can be transfigured by our complete belief in Him. Let us give all to the Lord and receive from the Lord whatever He sends us.
