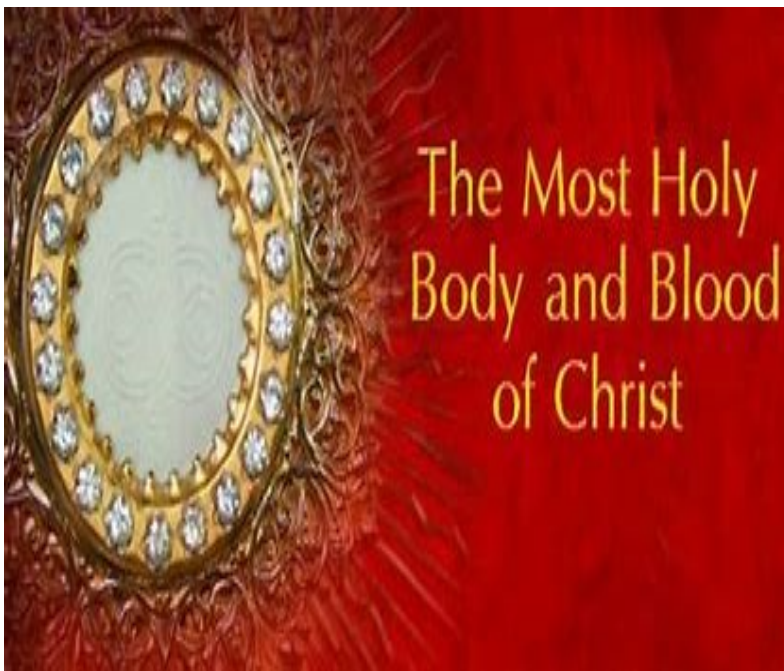

Today, we have so many different ways of remembering people. And remembering people is important for us to do. Life is all about remembering people and becoming a person of importance in individual life and becoming a person of popularity in social life. Jesus chose himself to be remembered in individual life as well as social life.

Jesus chose to be remembered with a meal, because it was the same way that God wanted the Passover to be remembered and celebrated. The Passover meal, with its roasted lamb, and unleavened bread, and bitter herbs, and wine, maybe is not the way that we would have chosen to remember the Passover, but it was what God commanded the Jewish people to do. With that background, it became a very natural progression for Jesus and the Christians to also remember what God had done through His Son, Jesus Christ, with Bread and Wine, taken right out of the Passover meal. This meal, this Eucharist, becomes our connection then to Jesus and to what He has done for each and every one of us! And on this Feast Day, the Feast of the Holy Body and Blood of Christ, or what we used to call Corpus Christi, we celebrate this extraordinary gift, this remembrance, this monument to Christ's love and promise to be with us always.

My brothers and sisters, we need this gift. We need the Eucharist in our lives, so that we never forget Jesus and what He has done for us. God could have chosen any number of ways for us to remember Him. He could have given us a picture. He could have given us a strong scent or perfume. He could have had us build a huge monument to what He came to teach us. Instead, Jesus chose a meal. Bread and Wine transformed into the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity, of Himself for all time. Let us always take advantage of this Gift. May we use it to remember! And may use it to stay connected to God Who wants us to be at His banquet feast of Heaven forever!

+ May God bless us on this great Feast, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit... AMEN !!!

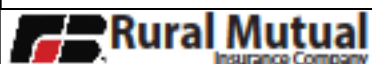
