"I will not have the ashes on my forehead" says one of the CCD Children. I asked her why? "Ashes come from fire so it may hurt me" she said. I smiled and said, "What about my hand? I take the ashes in my finger, and I am not hurt." She thought for a while and said, "Ok". I explained to the class about the importance of Ash Wednesday and what the ashes signifies?

We are dust and unto dust we shall return (Genesis 3:19). The life we live is momentary, passing and decaying. But what is permanent? God.

Ashes refer to nothing. We are nothing without God. What makes us everything is self-surrender to the ultimate love of God. Jesus said, "without me you can do nothing (John 15:5). - ◆ Lent starts this Wednesday with Ash Wednesday. Mass times are St. Bartholomew: 10:00 a.m. and 6:15 p.m. and St. Mary: 6:15 p.m. There will be Mass every day during the week at 10:00 a.m. at St. Bartholomew.
- St. Ansgar Church, Blair, Lenten Fish Fry is Friday, April 8, serving 4-7. Drive up only. Adults: \$11. Child: \$5
- Mission Trip 2022, Schriever, Louisiana July 24-31, 2022 Plans are in the works for a beautiful week of service to Louisiana to provide relief for a very demolished area. This city was demolished by Hurricane Ida, which hit in August of 2021. We are working with Catholic Charities and the Diocese of Houma-Thibodaux to set the housing and job sites organized. They have secured us housing at the Lumen Christi Retreat Center. There will be beds for all and is in a dorm like setting. The center will also provide our breakfast and dinners each day. We will be working with Catholic Charities and the Cajun Navy on the job sites. Students must have at least completed their freshman year of high school to qualify. We will leave Prairie du Chien on Sunday, July 24 in the evening by Warco Bus to Schriever, Louisiana. We will make our camp there for the week, and start our work on Tuesday morning. We will work through Friday. We are planning a fun event with a possible airboat ride to see alligators and a few other little sightseeing tours as our fun day Saturday. Then we will return home on Sunday July 31, 2022. We are following all Covid guidelines and taking every precaution necessary. Let's all pray that by that time things are much improved by then. Cost of the trip is \$400. Only out of pocket expenses will be meals on the ride to and from Louisiana and souvenirs. We are asking for at least a \$200 deposit by March 15th to hold the spot, and paid in full by May 1, 2022. Questions? - ◆ Lenten Regulations The season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, March 2. Lenten regulations are as follows: 1. Catholics who have celebrated their 14th birthday are to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays in Lent, and Good Friday. 2. In addition to abstaining from meat, Catholics who have celebrated their 18th birthday, until they celebrate their 59th birthday, are to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Those who are bound to this regulation may eat only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.
