This Sunday in the word of the Lord we hear Jesus telling his disciples and the people which left them unsettled, disturbed, troubled and afraid.

On occasion of the Last Supper (Jn 14), The disciples were having an enjoyable Passover meal. The food had been eaten, the wine had been drunk and familiar stories had been told. But as the disciples kept listening to Jesus, their mood changed. He kept saying things which made them feel uncomfortable. **He talked of going away** and because they had no idea what he was talking about. His disciples started getting agitated.

‘Do not let your hearts be troubled or afraid’ he said. He wanted his disciples to remember all he had said because he knew that what was about to happen to him would challenge them in a way, end they would find hard.

Later in John’s gospel we read how on Easter day when God raised Jesus from the dead ‘the doors were closed in the room where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews.’ (Jn 20) How did they overcome their fears? They did so by being reminded of all Jesus had said to them; the Holy Spirit did this for them teaching them; stirring the fire of their faith into something which grew strong.

My friends, do not think the work of the Holy Spirit is now extinguished! Do not think that what the Holy Spirit did long ago cannot be done now in our own time. Jesus gives the Holy Spirit to us so that when our mood is disturbed, when the circumstances of life leave us troubled and afraid, a divine prompting can take place. The Holy Spirit may do this for us by reminding us of something Jesus said such as ‘I give you a peace which the world cannot give’.

I will be away this weekend for the Masses in Coon Valley and Viroqua. Please join me for Rosary at 3 PM in the Grotto in St. Bartholomew.
