What Must I Do to Inherit Eternal Life?

It's all about relationship! So what's love got to do with it?

When the lawyer tests Jesus with the question, "What must I do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus turns it right back on him by asking, "What is written in the law? How do you read?"

The lawyer's answer? "You shall love the Lord your God with your whole heart, soul, mind, and strength; and your neighbor as myself."

Jesus' skewers him: "Do this and you shall live."

Does this make us a little uneasy? It should. Because no human has **ever** loved God (except Mary)—heart, soul, mind, and strength—for their whole life. We all come up short, don't we? We' all sinners.

We don't get to heaven by being "nice" people. We aren't. We get there by being humble enough to recognize and turn away from all that separates us from Him. We too need to go to the cross, trusting His promise to forgive to all who repent. Because, in the end, isn't it about loving Him enough to trust Him?

If you doubt that, just look at who God loves: Jacob was a cheater; Peter had a temper; David had an affair; Noah got drunk; Jonah ran from God; Paul was a murderer; Miriam was a gossip; Martha was a worrier; Thomas was a doubter; Sara was impatient; Elijah was moody; and Abraham was old. But in the end, they all turned their lives around to trust and live for Him.

If we turn to Him as they did, not counting the cost, we too will live! That's His promise.

Then He shows us what it really means to love our neighbor as ourselves - to show mercy, even towards our enemies, as the Samaritan did to the Jew. Jesus isn't *asking* us to like or feel good about them, He *commands* us to do good to them and pray for them, showing us what this looks like when He goes to Calvary for our sake.

Our sin has made us like the man half dead on the road. Christ, through the sacraments, pours oil and wine into our wounds, washes us, and makes us clean and whole. His love and compassion restores us to life showing us what it really means to love our neighbor.
