THE BLESSED PATH

(adapted from Scott Hahn's newsletter)

In the readings since Christmas, Jesus has been revealed as the new royal son of David & Son of God. He's sent to lead a new exodus, bringing Israel out of captivity to the nations & bringing all nations to God.

As Moses led Israel from Egypt through the sea to give them God's law on Mount Sinai, Jesus too has passed through the waters in baptism, going to the mountain to proclaim a new law—the law of His Kingdom.

The Beatitudes mark the fulfillment of God's covenant promise to Abraham—that through his descendants God would bless all the nations of the world.

Jesus is the son of Abraham & through the wisdom He speaks today, He bestows the Father's blessings upon "the poor in spirit."

He chooses to bless the weak & lowly, the foolish & despised in the eyes of the world. The poor in spirit are those who know that nothing they do can merit His mercy & grace, the humble remnant of the 1st reading, who seek refuge in the name of the Lord.

The Beatitudes reveal the divine path & purpose for our lives. All our striving should be for these virtues—to be poor in spirit; meek & clean of heart; merciful & makers of peace; seekers of the righteousness that comes from living the law of Kingdom.

The path the Lord sets before us today is one of trials & persecution. But He promises comfort in our mourning & a great reward in the end.

Even when life gets messy, relationships get difficult, our job becomes a grind, a loved one dies, we need to remember that we are not made for this world. St. Francis De Sales tells us to, "Say frequently in the midst of your contradictions, 'This is the path to heaven.'" It works! When we look at our present reality through an eternal perspective, seeing our life in light of heaven, everything changes.

The Kingdom we inherit is not of earth, but the promised land of heaven, where the Lord reigns forever. As we sing in today's Psalm, its blessings are for those whose hope is in the Lord.
