AFFAIR OF THE HEART

Jesus came not to abolish but to "fulfill" the Law of Moses & the teachings of the prophets, not just by following rules of behavior, but from a mind & heart totally devoted to loving His Father & His people.

In this, He shows us also how we too can fulfill the Law & the Prophets. Keeping the rules is not enough!

The law of Jesus' New Covenant is one that God has written on our heart, the seat of our motivations, the place from which our words & actions proceed—not the place of our emotions, as perceived by many.

Jesus tells us to train our hearts, to master our passions & emotions. He demands the full obedience of our hearts in loving God & doing His will.

He knows us, so never demands more than we're capable of. It is up to us to choose good or evil, life or death. He never gives anyone a license to sin.

By His life, death, & Resurrection, Jesus has shown us that keeping His commandments is possible. Painful, yes—but possible! It's spiritual warfare, & the battle-field is our mind—that part of us that's unredeemed & responds to Satan's wiles, fighting against that part of us undergoing transformation through the Spirit & Word of God.

So don't be MIA! That'll put your soul in grave danger! Jesus overcame all this. We can too if we abide in Him – taking up our cross daily, giving control of our life over to Him, & living, not in our own power, but in the power of the Holy Spirit.

Haven't experienced His power in your life? Then it's time you & He had some serious dialogue (not a monologue). Don't know how? Swallow your complacency! Seek Him! He promised if you did, you'd find Him. He didn't leave us as orphans to fight this battle alone!

So, with St. Paul, let's pray for the revelation of the Holy Spirit, trusting in His wisdom rather than ours to live His kingdom law.

And with the Psalmist let's pray that we grow in the ability to live Jesus' Gospel & to seek the Father with all our heart.
