

It Ends with Me

In today's Gospel the Lord is teaching us, by His grace, to break the cycle of hatred & vengeance. When someone harms me, I get angry. Sometimes I might try to get back at them. But if I do that, Satan gains a second victory bringing anger & vengeance up a notch. Because then the one who harmed me will most likely try to get even. So, the cycle continues. Satan loves this.

Break the cycle! The Lord has sent us onto the field to turn the game around. He wants us to execute the "it ends with me" play, just as He did. We break this cycle by taking the hit & not returning it. By loving our enemy, we break the cycle of hate. By refusing retribution, we rob Satan of a double victory.

Recall the words of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.:

Darkness cannot drive out darkness; only light can do that. Hate cannot drive out hate; only love can do that. Hate multiplies hate, violence multiplies violence, & toughness multiplies toughness in a descending spiral of destruction. ... The chain reaction of evil—hate begetting hate, wars producing more wars—must be broken, or we shall be plunged into the dark abyss of annihilation.

Christ, living in us, wants to break the cycle of hate & violence. He's not merely telling us to stop being so thin-skinned, He's describing the change that'll happen to us as we allow His grace to increasingly transforms us. To the degree that we're transformed, we'll not seek to get even. We'll leave that to God. "Beloved, never avenge yourselves, but leave it to the wrath of God; for it is written, "Vengeance is mine, I will repay, says the Lord."

Only a transformed mind & heart is able to "LOVE YOUR ENE-MY." This is the acid test, the hallmark of a true Christian. Note that the Lord links this to being a true child of God. A Christian is called to fulfill the Law & exceed it. This does.

But don't make love an abstraction. The Lord is talking about real transformation. It happens to the degree we give Jesus' permission to live His life in us. As we do, we *will* good & *do* good to them who hate us, just as Jesus did.

So don't sentimentalize this love. Jesus loved His enemies but didn't coddle them. He spoke truth to power, often forcefully & uncompromisingly. We're to do the same, speaking the truth in love to everyone, great or small, with understanding & compassion, willing to take the consequences of doing so for His sake.

Finally, the Lord says, "So be perfect, just as your heavenly Father is perfect." Nothing less will do. How could there be anything less when Christ lives His life in us?

Jesus wants the downward spiral of hatred & vengeance to end with me. When, on account of His grace, I don't retaliate, I break the cycle. When I don't escalate the bitterness or return the spite, when I refuse to allow hate to take possession of me, the cycle ends with me. Only God can do this in & for me.

But He does do it. The promise of our Lord is true. He has said it & He will do it—if we let Him.

- ♦ Lenten Regulations The season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, Feb. 22. Lenten regulations are as follows:
 - 1. Catholics who have celebrated their 14th birthday are to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, all Fridays in Lent, and Good Friday.
 - 2. In addition to abstaining from meat, Catholics who have celebrated their 18th birthday, until they celebrate their 59th birthday, are to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Those who are bound to this regulation may eat only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.


