### THE TEMPTER APPROACHES

We see in today's readings temptation & the tempter, defeat & victory. Adam, the 1<sup>st</sup> son of God, capitulates in the face of evil masquerading as good but defying God. Baptized & empowered by the Holy Spirit, Jesus, the Son of God, the 2<sup>nd</sup> Adam, defeats evil masquerading as good by obeying God.

These are not just the temptations of Jesus - they are the temptations of the whole church. For instance, Jesus' response to the 1<sup>st</sup> temptation is this, "It is written, man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes from the mouth of God." What does this mean for our parish? Faith in our Father 1<sup>st</sup>, in ourselves 2<sup>nd</sup>. It means seeking God's will before taking action, even if it takes a while, including the why & the way we raise money! E.g. God say's 'tithe,' we say 'raffle.'

Sometimes we think that because we're Catholic, our ideas must automatically be God's will. Not so! That's presumption, not faith. Jesus says, "You shall not put the Lord your God to the test." Seeking God's will 1<sup>st</sup> – faith & trust – must be the bedrock of everything we do as the Body of Christ. We as Church have only one thing to offer the world – Jesus! He must be visible – by Name & by activity – in everything we do. God 1<sup>st</sup>!

The devil says, "bend & worship me & I'll give you what you want." Jesus says, "Worship the Lord your God, & serve Him alone." There are so many things about which I've heard Catholics say, "Well, God doesn't care about that," like how we dress for & act at Mass & what we offer Him. His word is very clear about this. He desires our best in everything, our 1st fruits, without spot or blemish. Why? Love! Because there's no One greater; no One who loves us more. Anything less puts ourselves, not Him, 1st.

We'll all be tempted during Lent, perhaps to hate, or to steal, or to a sexual sin, or maybe to just goof off, to not do anything. So be alert! If you're reading scripture, the Lord will provide you with an answer to the temptation in what you're reading.

Repent & believe the Gospel.

- Lenten Regulations The season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, Feb. 22. Lenten regulations are as follows:
  - 1. Catholics who have celebrated their 14th birthday are to abstain from meat on all Fridays in Lent, and Good Friday.
  - 2. In addition to abstaining from meat, Catholics who have celebrated their 18th birthday, until they celebrate their 59th birthday, are to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Those who are bound to this regulation may eat only one full meal. Two smaller meals are permitted if necessary to maintain strength according to one's needs, but eating solid foods between meals is not permitted.
