WE 'RE ALL LAZARUS

In today's Gospel Lazarus represents all humanity—for "dead men"— all those who Jesus loves & wants to liberate from the bonds of sin & death. Lazarus' death is used by Jesus to reveal "the glory of God."

Jesus said to them, "Untie him & let him go free."

Notice something important here: Although Jesus raises Lazarus, giving him new life, He also commands the bystanders to untie Lazarus & let him go free. Christ raises us, but He has work for the Church to do: untie those He has raised in baptism & let them go free.

To have a personal relationship with Jesus is crucial, but it is also essential to have a relationship to the Church. Note that after raising Lazarus, Jesus entrusts him to the care of others. Here Jesus speaks to the Church—parents, priests, catechists, *all* members of the Church—giving them this standing order regarding the souls He has raised to new life in Baptism: "Untie them & let them go free."

We are Lazarus. we were dead in our sin, but we have been raised to new life. Yet we can still be bound by the effects of sin. This is why we need the sacraments, Scripture, prayer, & other ministries of the Church through catechesis, preaching, & teaching. Lazarus' healing wasn't a "one & you're done" scenario & neither is ours.

We are *also* the bystanders. Just as we are in need of being untied & set free, we have this obligation to do so to others. By God's grace, parents must untie their children & let them go free; pastors must do the same with their flocks.

This is the Lord's mandate to the Church regarding every soul He has raised: "Untile him & let him go free." This is the Lord's work. But just as Jesus involved the bystanders then, He still involves the Church—us—now.

Faith is the key. If we believe as Martha does—that Jesus is the resurrection & the life—we'll see that Jesus loves each of us as He loved Lazarus, & that He calls us out of death into new life, eternal life!
