"TAKE MY YOKE!"

2000 years ago, there were many rabbis all over Israel. They were role models & teachers. If you became a rabbi's disciple, your relationship with him was not only to find out what he believed, but to learn to live the way he did.

Nobody chose a rabbi; the rabbi chose them. But only if he thought you were capable of learning to be like him—to think & live his way. If he didn't choose you, he didn't think you could.

Jesus was a rabbi. But He's also God. Big difference between Him & the other rabbis! His relationship with His followers was very, very intimate. This Rabbi—the creator of all that is & your bridegroom—now wants to enter into a relationship with you. He chooses you. He invites you to, "Come unto Me." He knows you've got what it takes to be like him!

Like every 1st century rabbi, Jesus tells those who would accept His invitation to, "Take My yoke upon yourself & learn from Me." What does that mean?

The yoke of a rabbi was his worldview. Jesus means, "take My worldview upon yourself. Learn to see the world the way I see it. Live your life the way I do." So, what does that mean in how you relate to others?

It means this: you're not here to convince people of what you personally believe politically, socially. You're here to figure out & convey Jesus' worldview & will; how to deal with our own inadequacies & sin, & how to live. Then to become like Jesus, putting His worldview & will into practice.

There's a whole bunch of worldviews out there that are contrary Jesus's. You & I have got to figure out how to confront these worldviews in a way where we don't alienate people on purpose, but in charity & love we bring them into a greater life.

It's not just about warming the pew on Sunday. It means spending a large amount of time with our Master & Rabbi—in prayer, the word, & deep thought about life & living—listening for the guiding whisper of the Holy Spirit. Then doing as He directs.

He's inviting us again today: "Come unto Me! Take My yoke upon you!" Will you?
