

MADE CLEAN

In today's Gospel Jesus heals a leper. In Scripture, leprosy describes more than just a disease; it's a metaphor for sin. Obviously leprosy itself is not sin, but its effects are similar, so this passage includes us. Like leprosy, sin disfigure & deteriorates us, distances us from others, & brings death if unchecked. Only God has the power to cure leprosy & cleanse from sin.

So, what about us spiritual lepers? Today's Gospel suggests four steps to find healing from the leprosy of sin.

- 1. Admit the Reality Like the leper in the Gospel, we must start with step one: admitting the reality of our sin & humbly asking the Lord for help.
- 2. Accept the Relationship It's our relationship with the Lord, established by faith, that we're justified, transformed, healed, & saved. If we want to be free of the leprosy of our sin, we must accept the saving relationship with Jesus & let Him touch us.
- 3. Apply the Remedy Having healed the leper, Jesus instructs him to follow through: "See that you tell no one anything, but go, show yourself to the priest & offer for your cleansing what Moses prescribed; that will be proof for them."

Why should he do this? After all, the Lord has already healed him. We can only answer, "Do what Jesus says: show yourself to the priest & offer your penance." It's clear from this passage that confession is to be a part of a believer's life, especially in the case of serious sin.

4. Announce the Result – This is rather puzzling: Jesus warns the healed leper not to tell a soul other than the priest. But His reason is made clear later in the passage; He doesn't want His mission turned into a magic show where people gathered just to see miracles.

That said, the command to remain silent <u>cannot</u> hold for us who have this standing order: "<u>Go therefore & make disciples of all nations</u>" (Matt 28:19-20).

So, whatever God has done for you, big or small, don't keep it to yourself. Telling others the good news of what God has done for you is at the heart of evangelization. Just do it!
