#### To Be Greatest is to Serve

My Dear Brothers and Sisters, the twenty-fifth Sunday invites us to reflect that Jesus Christ is the wisdom that came down from heaven to serve humanity. So, we are called to listen to him and follow his example by living an orderly and peaceful life.

Today's first reading is fulfilled in the life of Christ. it points to Christ, the Son of God, who was put to death by jealous and wicked people. As a righteous man, Jesus reprimanded and condemned the ambitious Pharisees and scribes of his time. So, they took offense and persecuted and crucified Christ.

Like Christ we too may suffer unjust persecutions today for being right and just. However, we must remain steadfast because God will surely vindicate us.

Our second reading reminds us of the importance of focusing sincerely on the things that unite us rather than on the ones that divide us. We all desire a harmonious life, yet many Christian communities, families, and homes live in frequent conflicts and disorder. So, James admonishes us not to let selfish ambitions destroy our relationships, families, and communities.

Jesus foretells his imminent suffering, death, and resurrection in today's gospel. Unfortunately, instead of reflecting on what Christ was saying, his disciples quarreled secretly over who was the greatest. Their argument was aimed at the earthly government, so His disciples were experiencing a conflict of interest.

We often see this everywhere that personal ambition is considered more important than anything else. There, we see in-fighting, gossip, indifference, aggression, threats to lives and property, hatred, and all sorts of vices. All these come at the expense of the common good and peaceful coexistence. Wherever these exist, there can be no progress, prosperity, and peace.

Therefore, by using a child as an example for us today, Jesus only teaches us that we must become like children to be great. It means that we must live our lives in humble service to God and one another. God Bless You All!
