The Greatest Commandments: Love God and Love our neighbor

My Dear Brothers and Sisters, On the 31st Sunday, we reflect on key teachings from the readings, loving God and our neighbor. Also, today's readings guide us in understanding love, obedience, and Jesus' eternal priesthood.

In the First Reading from the book of Deuteronomy, we are commanded to love God with all our heart, soul, and strength. This shows the importance of putting God first in our lives. It also calls us to keep God's commandments. Obeying these commandments brings us closer to God and guides our actions.

The Second reading from the Hebrews, emphasizes that Jesus is our eternal high priest who intercedes for us. His priesthood is perfect and unchanging, unlike the priests of the old covenant. In obedience to his Father's will, Christ offered the greatest sacrifice of love with his own life. He died, to save us.

In today's gospel, Christ summarizes the Ten Commandments into two. He teaches that the greatest commandments are to love God and love our neighbor. These two commandments summarize the entire law and the prophets and unite love and law. True love for God naturally leads to loving others and keeping God's commandments.

If we can obey the second, then we can, and have indeed observed the first. This is because God lives in our neighbor. We cannot hate or harm our neighbor for any reason, and still claim we love God or his commandments.

However, Christ is not asking us to do what He could not do. He overcame all these enemies of love. Any Christian who overcomes these enemies will love sincerely.

The good news is that Christ knows it is possible. If it were not so, He would not have commanded us to love. So, to love God and our neighbor as ourselves is a "debt," we owe and must pay.

So, like Christ, our eternal high priest, when we offer this sacrifice and debt of love that gives perfect glory to God. God Bless You All!
