THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD

When we hear today's Gospel we might ask, "Why did Jesus want to be baptized by John?" After all, He is the incarnate Son of God, the sinless 2nd Person of the Trinity.

True. So why?

Jesus didn't need to be baptized! His intention was to reveal God's love us even though we have sinned against Him. He was identifying Himself with sinful humanity—with you & me, emptying Himself of His divine glory & joining Himself to us in our state of alienation from the Father. Jesus' baptism wasn't so much for Him as it was for us. It inaugurated His mission to us & for us.

Christ was baptized—immersed—into our human life so that we would be baptized—immersed—into His divine life. When we were baptized, we were baptized into Christ & received the gift of the Holy Spirit. We are joined to Christ & His mission in order to make real God's kingdom where we live.

There are temptations on our part to think that God's gift of salvation is automatic, that all we have to do is believe, & we will be saved; that we can do His work without asking for the power of His Spirit. The simple truth is that a gift is not a gift unless we receive it. Love isn't effective unless we accept it—& then act on it. Salvation is ours only if we receive it by acting on it, by living the spiritual & corporal acts of mercy as 'little Christs' in our world today, even in those places we seldom go.

We don't act & then come to believe; we believe & then come to act. Our actions come from our love; our love doesn't result from our actions. Our words & actions either reveal God's love or hide it.

The baptism of Christ was out in public—it wasn't private. Christian living isn't private—it's public. The question to be answered now is "How will we respond?" How will we pivot from maintenance to mission, to rebuild God's Church? The answer is found in our lived-out baptismal faith. We're here to know God & to make Him known—to receive His love & then, in the power of the Holy Spirit, to share His love with others.
