A PERFECT OFFERING

God is telling us today through the prophet Isaiah of the mission He's given to His Son, even from the womb: "You are My servant."

Servant & Son, our Lord was sent to lead a new exodus—to raise up the exiled tribes of Israel & to gather & restore them to God. More than that, He was to be a light to the nations, that God's salvation reaches to the ends of the earth.

Before the first exodus, a lamb was offered in sacrifice & its blood painted on the Israelites' door posts. The blood of the lamb identified their homes & the Lord "passed over" these in executing judgment on the Egyptians & their gods.

In the new exodus, Jesus is the Lamb of God! Today's Psalm declares that He has come to offer His body to do the will of God. In doing so, He is giving us a model to form our lives around. We, too, are to offer our bodies, our lives, to God so that we may please Him by cooperating with Him in bringing His love & healing to wounded people in a broken world. In this, we do the possible & let Him do the impossible. Nothing delights Him more!

The sacrifices, oblations, holocausts, & sin-offerings given after the first exodus had no power to take away sins. They were meant not to save us but to teach us. In offering these sacrifices, the people were to learn self-sacrifice—that they were made for worship, to offer themselves freely to God & to delight in His will.

Only Jesus could make that perfect offering of Himself. Through His sacrifice, He has given us ears open to obedience & made it possible for us to hear the Father's call to holiness.

He's made us children of God, not only having been baptized in water, but in the blood of the Lamb. We're to join our sacrifice to His, to offer our bodies as living sacrifices to Him. To be a Christian is not primarily about "becoming a good person" or "doing the right thing"—anyone can do any of those things. Rather, baptism draws us into relationship with the Father, the Son, & the Holy Spirit. Baptism is all about grace—our incorporation, through the power of God's love, into His own life & mission of being light in our world.
