Stewardship Bulletin Reflection

2 SM 12:7-10, 13; PS 32:1-2, 5, 7, 11; GAL 2:16, 19-21; LK 7:36—8:3

Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time. Today's readings remind us of the power of God's mercy and the call to respond with gratitude, which naturally inspires us to serve others actively.

In the Gospel, we see a powerful contrast between those who recognize their need for God's mercy and those who do not. The woman who approaches Jesus recognizes her need—and her response is one of deep love and gratitude.

As Christian Stewards, recognizing how much God has shown us mercy can ignite a sense of purpose, prompting us to respond with genuine gratitude and active service.

The gratitude we feel is expressed in the way we live—in how we use our time, talent, and treasure in service to God and others, such as volunteering, giving generously, or offering kind words.

The more we recognize God's mercy in our lives, the more generously we will respond.

The Mission COOP Program The Diocese of Batticaloa—Sri Lanka

The Diocese of Batticaloa is in eastern Sri Lanka, where Catholics make up only about 3.5% of the population. Despite being a small minority, the diocese serves its people through 30 parishes, priests, religious sisters and brothers, and over 500 catechists who provide faith formation, especially for children.

The diocese runs various ministries and social programs, including orphanages, a home for disabled children (Ozanam Centre), support for leprosy patients, education programs, livelihood assistance for widows, youth formation, evangelization, and reconciliation efforts. Lay catechists play a vital role in teaching the faith, particularly where Catholic religious education is not available in schools. The diocese also faces significant challenges, including funding for seminarians, support and training for catechists, education for poor children, care for disabled children, rebuilding churches damaged by war and tsunami, and expanding evangelization efforts.
